Analysis

- DC was suppose to shut down during the 2013 government shutdown, but former Mayor Vincent Gray said all city services would be labeled as "essential" and would be paid using a contingency reserve fund
- There was \$150 million in the contingency reserve fund at the beginning of the government shutdown in 2013
- The Chief Financial Officer estimated that the city was spending \$10 million per day for local DC salaries
- Since the shutdown, the fund has been replenished and the city incurred few major expenses during the shutdown
