Influence House GOP Leadership

The House Freedom Caucus includes many members that voted against Speaker John Boehner's (R-OH) reelection to leadership. Following his resignation, the caucus endorsed Rep. Paul Ryan (R-WI) for Speaker.



Reform the Structure of the House

One of the caucus' primary goals is to overhaul House GOP rules in order to decentralize power. As part of this initiative, Speaker Ryan has convened a task force to reform the influential Steering Committee, which appoints members to House committees.



Reform Legislative Tactics

Members of the House Freedom Caucus tend to support more confrontational strategies on issues such as the federal budget and the debt ceiling. However, the caucus also seeks to end the practice of frantic, last-minute votes on deals struck by House GOP leadership. Overall, the caucus aims to advance a conservative agenda with minimal compromise.
