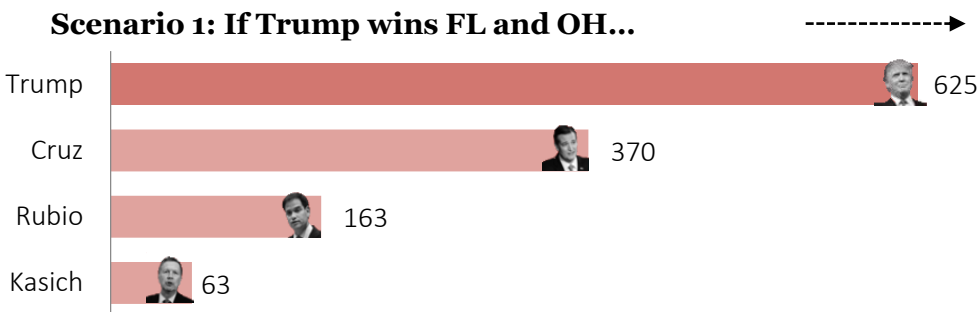


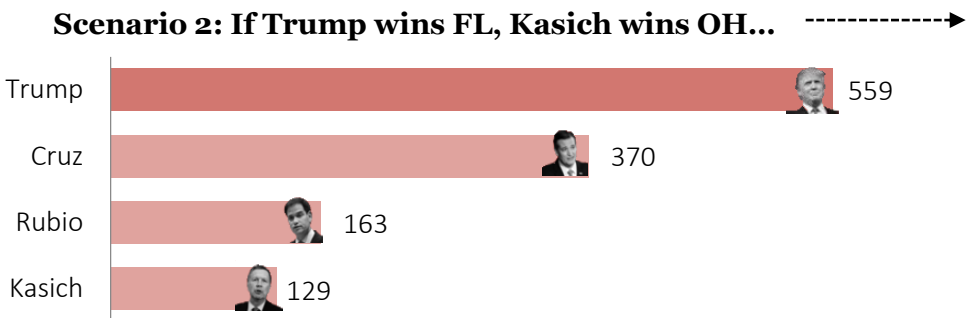
How FL and OH Primaries Could Decide the GOP Race

Projected Delegate Counts After March 15th Primaries in Ohio and Florida



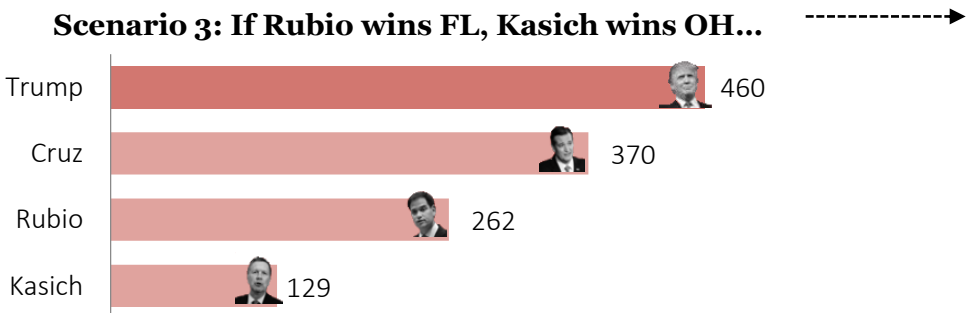
Trump needs 50% of remaining delegates

- Trump would have 51% of the delegates needed to secure the nomination
- Both Kasich and Rubio would likely drop out
- Trump’s path to nomination looks very promising



Trump needs 56% of remaining delegates

- Trump would have 45% of the delegates needed to secure the nomination
- Kasich would likely stay in the race, Rubio would likely drop out
- Trump’s path to a majority of delegates difficult but not impossible



Trump needs 64% of remaining delegates

- Trump would have 37% of the delegates needed to secure the nomination
- Both Kasich and Rubio would likely stay in the race
- Contested convention likely

*1,237 delegates needed to secure nomination,
1,012 delegates awarded after March 15 primaries*
