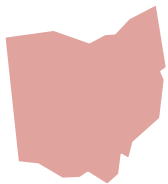


All Eyes Turn to Ohio As Both Races Will Impact The Future of the Primary Season

Ohio Republican Presidential Primary



Timing

- 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. ET.

Delegates

- The Republicans will award all 66 delegates to the statewide winner.

What to Watch For

- John Kasich will need large margins from the “three C’s”: Columbus, Cleveland and Cincinnati.
- Donald Trump is expected to do well in northeastern Ohio and the Dayton area, home to many blue-collar workers.

Ohio Democratic Presidential Primary



Timing

- 6:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. ET.

Delegates

- The Democrats have 143 pledged delegates allocated at the statewide level with a 15% threshold and 17 super delegates.

What to Watch For

- Hillary Clinton will likely rely on the “three C’s” like Kasich.
- Bernie Sanders is expected to find support in northeastern Ohio among rank-and-file union members.
