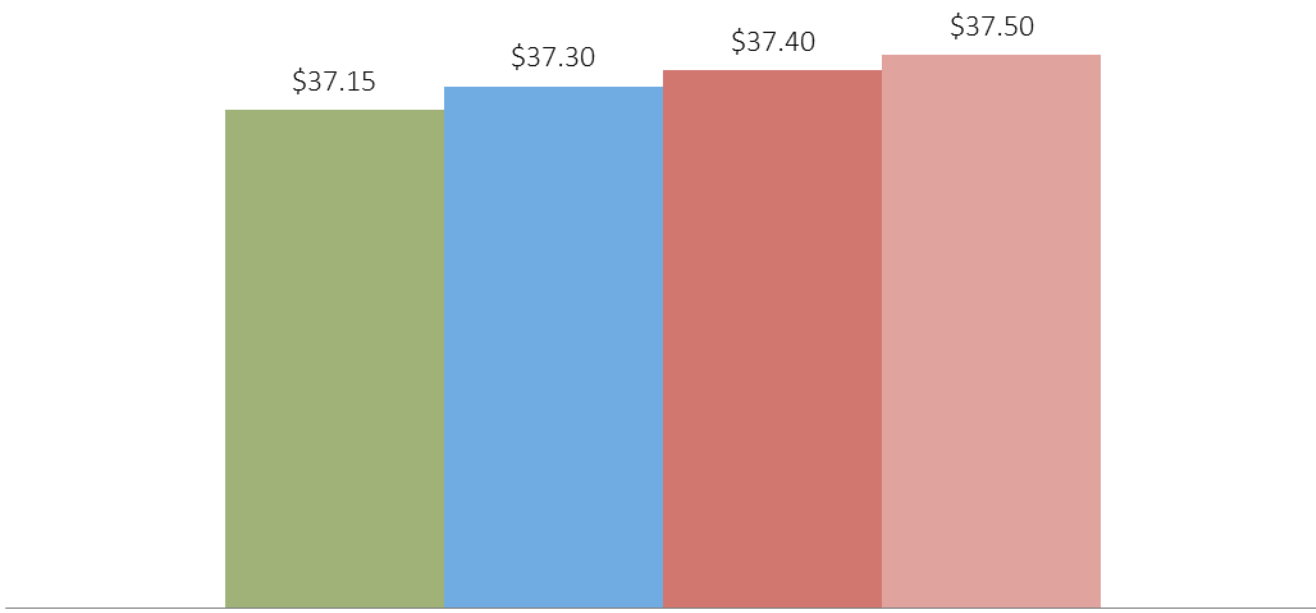

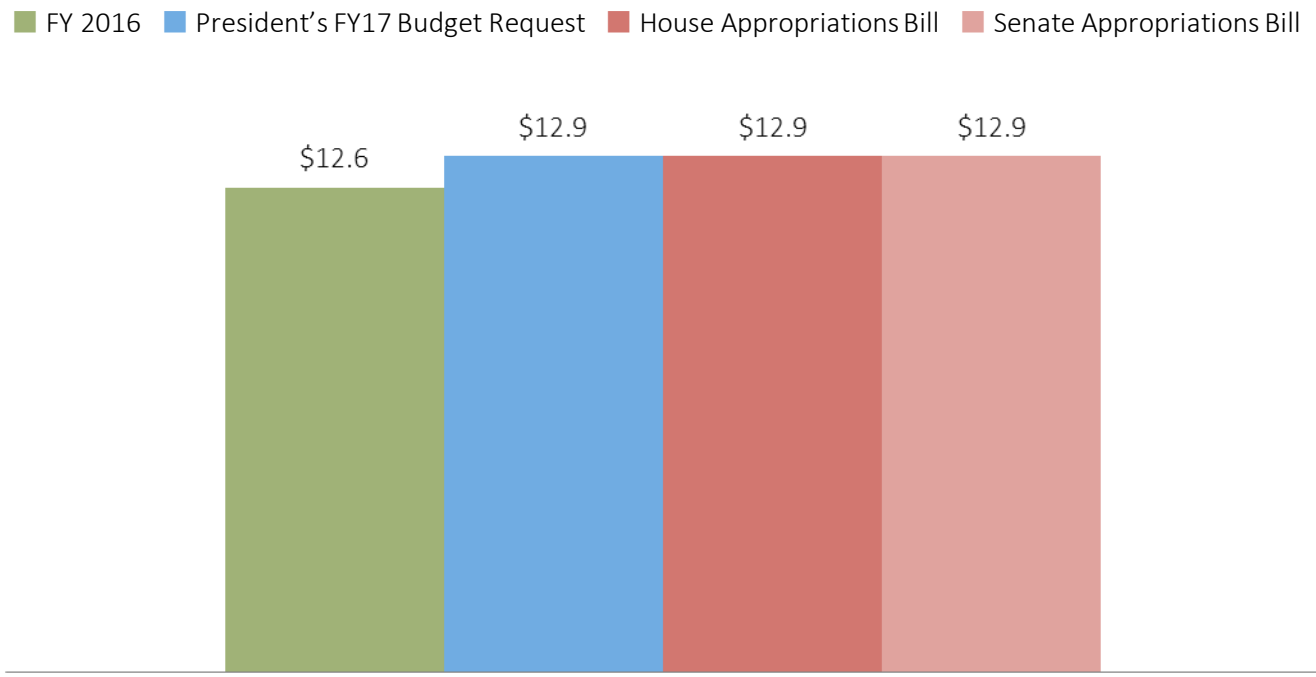

Measured in Billions of Dollars

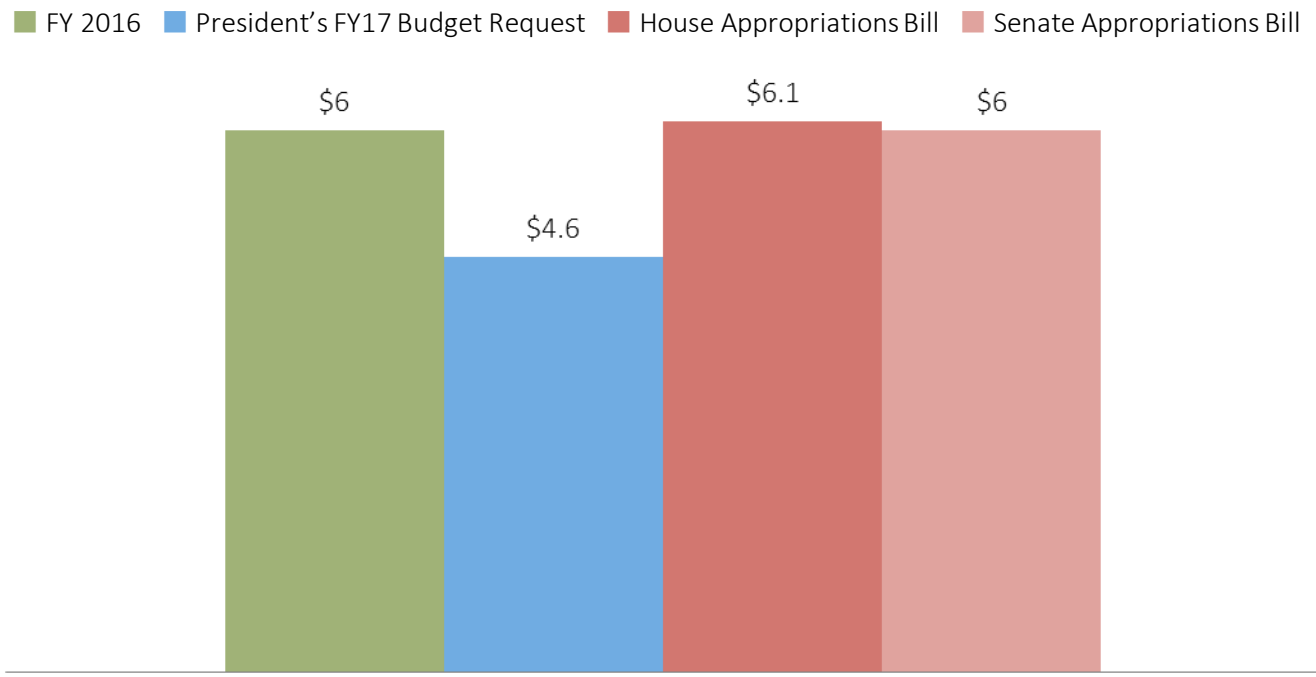

Measured in Billions of Dollars

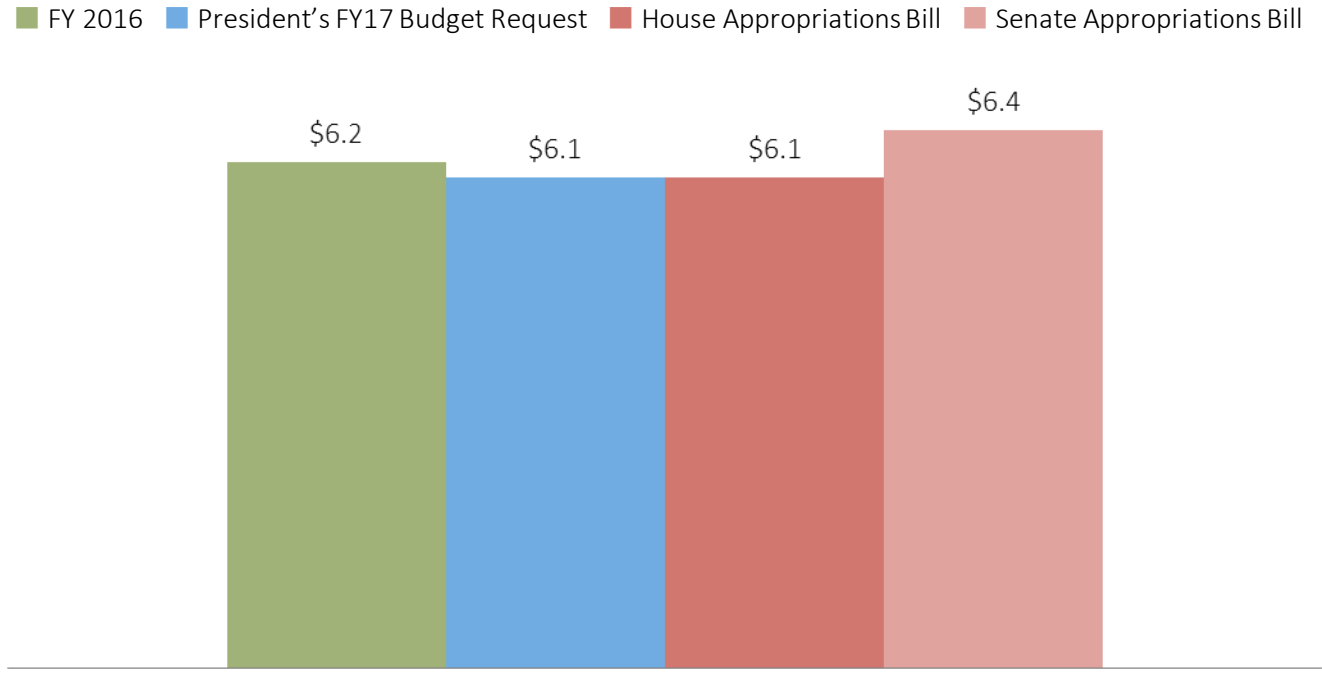

Measured in Billions of Dollars



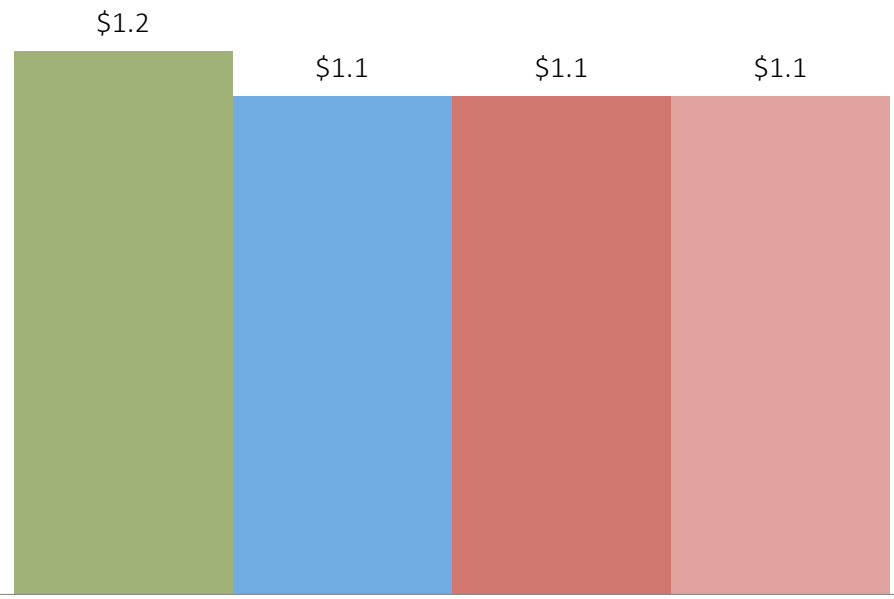

Limits on Water Rule

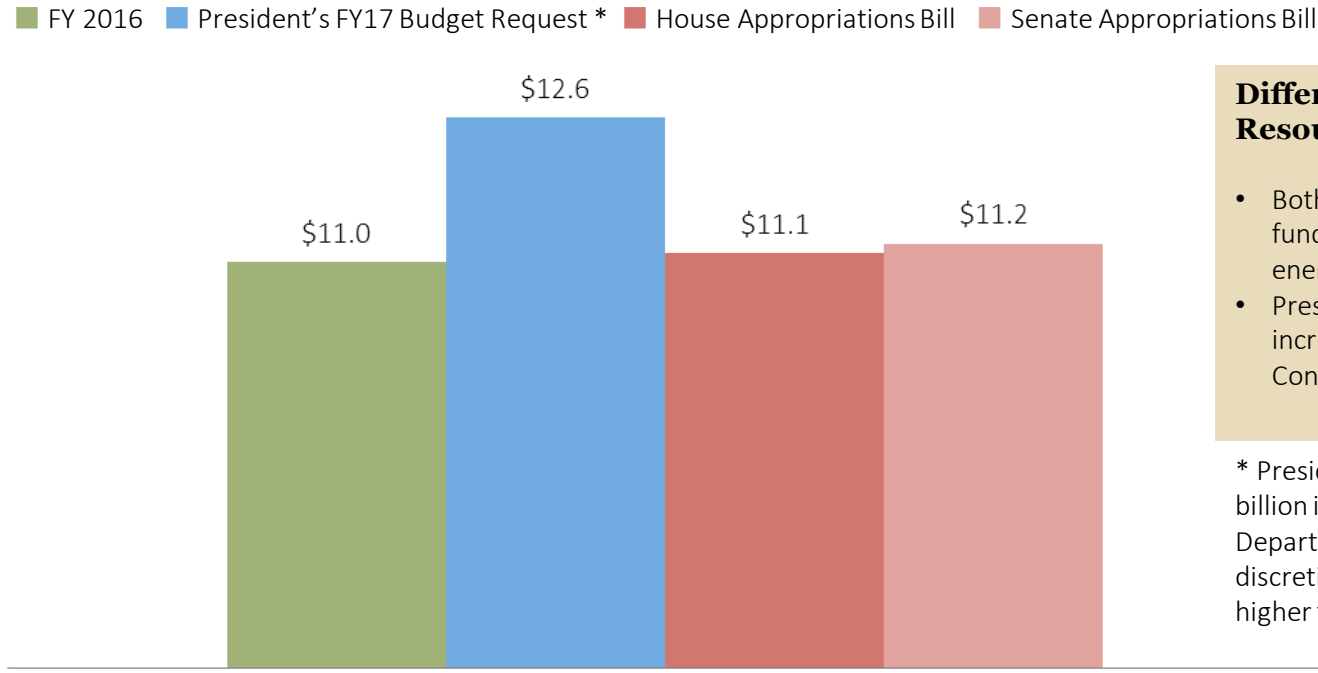
- Both the House and Senate include measures prohibiting changing the definitions of “fill” and “discharge” material under Clean Water Act
- This is in response to President Obama’s changes to Water Rules, which would allow grant greater regulatory power to Department of Interior and Bureau of Reclamation to regulate interior water resources

- Both Congressional proposals increasing funding for fossil fuels and nuclear energy research
- President’s budget request asked for increase funding for renewables, but Congress cuts renewable research funds

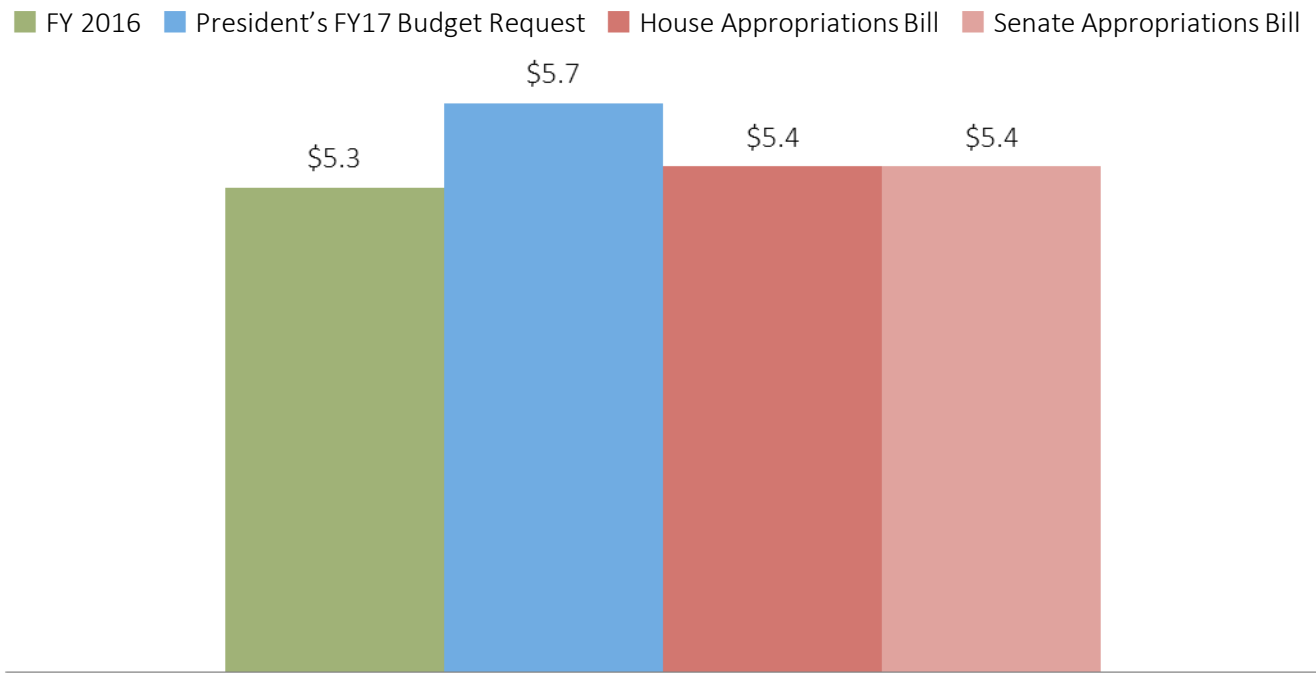
* President’s budget proposal includes \$1.6 billion in direct spending authority for the Department of Energy and \$11 billion in discretionary spending, which is why it is higher than Congress’ proposals
