

Clinton is On Track for a Victory in Maryland Due to Large Population of Minority Voters

Maryland Democratic Presidential Primary



Timing

- The polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Delegates

- The Democrats have 95 delegates allocated proportionally at the statewide level, as well as 23 super delegates, who are free to support any candidate.

What to Watch For

- Clinton is also on pace for a sizable victory here, thanks in large part to minority voters
- Blacks made up 37 percent of the electorate in the 2008 Maryland Democratic primary, which Obama dominated
- More than half the vote in 2008 came from Montgomery County, Prince George's County, Baltimore County and the city of Baltimore, all of which is favorable territory for Clinton.
- Maryland's primary is also open only to registered Democrats, which doesn't help Sanders's cause
