Young is the establishment favorite: groups tied to Sen. Mitch McConnell have shelled out millions to ensure that Young is the nominee. Polls show Young pulling away from Stutzman, the tea party favorite. The winner of the primary will face Rep. Baron Hill (D). Either Republican would be favored against Hill, but with Trump looking like the presumptive presidential nominee, Republicans aren't taking anything for granted.

Banks has a slight edge, with a recent poll showing him with 29% of the vote, followed by Tom at 23 percent and Brown at 22 percent. National conservative groups prefer Banks, a reliable ally from the state Senate.

Houchin and Zoeller have accused Hollignsworth of being a carpetbagger trying to buy elected office. Hollingsworth moved to the district last year and has donated more than \$1 million to his own campaign, and has been boosted by an additional \$375,000 from a super PAC funded by his father.
