





**Amount of Sexual Assaults Reported to DOD By Category** 



**Amount of Sexual Assaults Reported to DOD By Category** 




#### **Differences Between Unrestricted and Restricted Report**


- Unrestricted reports are when the chain of command is notified. This triggers an investigation into the claim about the sexual assault
- Restricted reports are when victims can receive mental and medical treatment without reporting to their chain of command
