





Agenda Category	Item on Agenda
Global Economy and Trade	<ul> <li>Encourage the adoption of free trade practices</li> <li>Address turbulent global markets and slowing growth in both emerging and developed countries</li> <li>Coordinating macroeconomic policy, especially monetary policy</li> </ul>
National Security/Terrorism	<ul> <li>Coordinating information sharing and counter-terrorism operations to combat trans-national terrorism</li> <li>Produce "G-7 Action Plan on Counter-terrorism and Violent Extremism"</li> <li>Addressing migrant crisis in Europe and broader Middle East</li> </ul>
Climate Change and Energy	<ul> <li>Further commit to the Paris Climate Agreement and actualizing voluntary emission reductions</li> <li>Jumpstart clean energy investment</li> </ul>
Infrastructure Development	<ul> <li>Improve quality and environmental impacts of internal infrastructure as a model for other states</li> <li>Commit to investing in global infrastructure to address \$1 trillion annual infrastructure deficit</li> </ul>




Total GDP of G7 Members, Measured in Billions of Dollars

### Besides the U.S., Much of the G7 Economies Have Been Stagnant For the Past Six Years At Around \$2-4 Trillion



#### Even With Slower Growth, G7 Makes Up Nearly Half of Global GDP


Percentage of Global GDP Produced By G7 Members

#### However, Percentage of Total World GDP Controlled by G7 Has Declined By Nearly 20% In Past 15 Years



### Rest of G7 Combined Spend A Little Over a Third of U.S. Military Expenditures On National Defense


Military Expenditures of G7 Members for 2015, in Billions of Dollars

# The Average Percentage of GDP Spent on Military Expenses in G7 Is About 1.5%


Percent of GDP Spent on Military Expenditures For G7 Members

# Largely Due to U.S., G7 Spends Roughly Half of All Global Military Expenditures


Percentage of Global Military Expenditures Spent By G7 Members

#### U.S. Has Biggest Population in G7, Larger Than the Next Three States (Japan, Germany and U.K) Combined


Populations of G7 Members, Measured in Millions
