


Infant Mortality Rate Country Comparison, Rate per 1,000 Live Births (2010)

## **Excluding Pre-term Births, US Still Lies Near Bottom of Developed Countries in Infant Mortality Rate**


**Infant Mortality Rate Excluding Births at <24 Weeks of Gestation**

#### Deep South has Highest Infant Mortality Rate; Western States Fare Better


Infant Deaths per 1,000 Live Births by State, in 2013

#### Appalachian States Struggle with Higher Infant Mortality Rates Among Non-Hispanic Whites


Non-Hispanic White Infant Deaths per 1,000 Live Births by State, in 2013

#### Non-Hispanic Black Infant Mortality Rate Far Higher than Other Ethnicities Nationwide


Non-Hispanic Black Infant Deaths per 1,000 Live Births by State, in 2013
