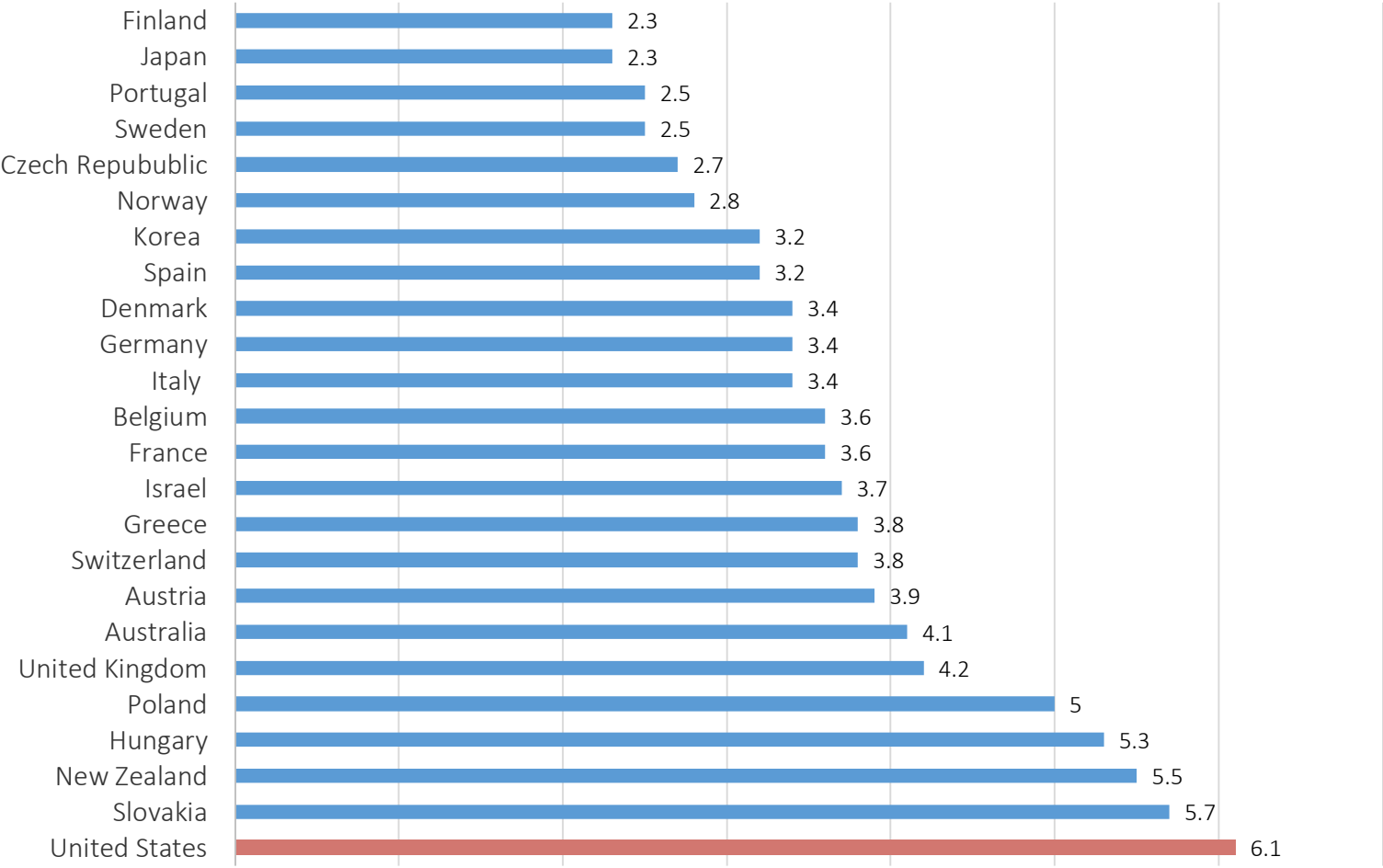


# US Infant Mortality Rates Remains Higher than Most Developed Countries

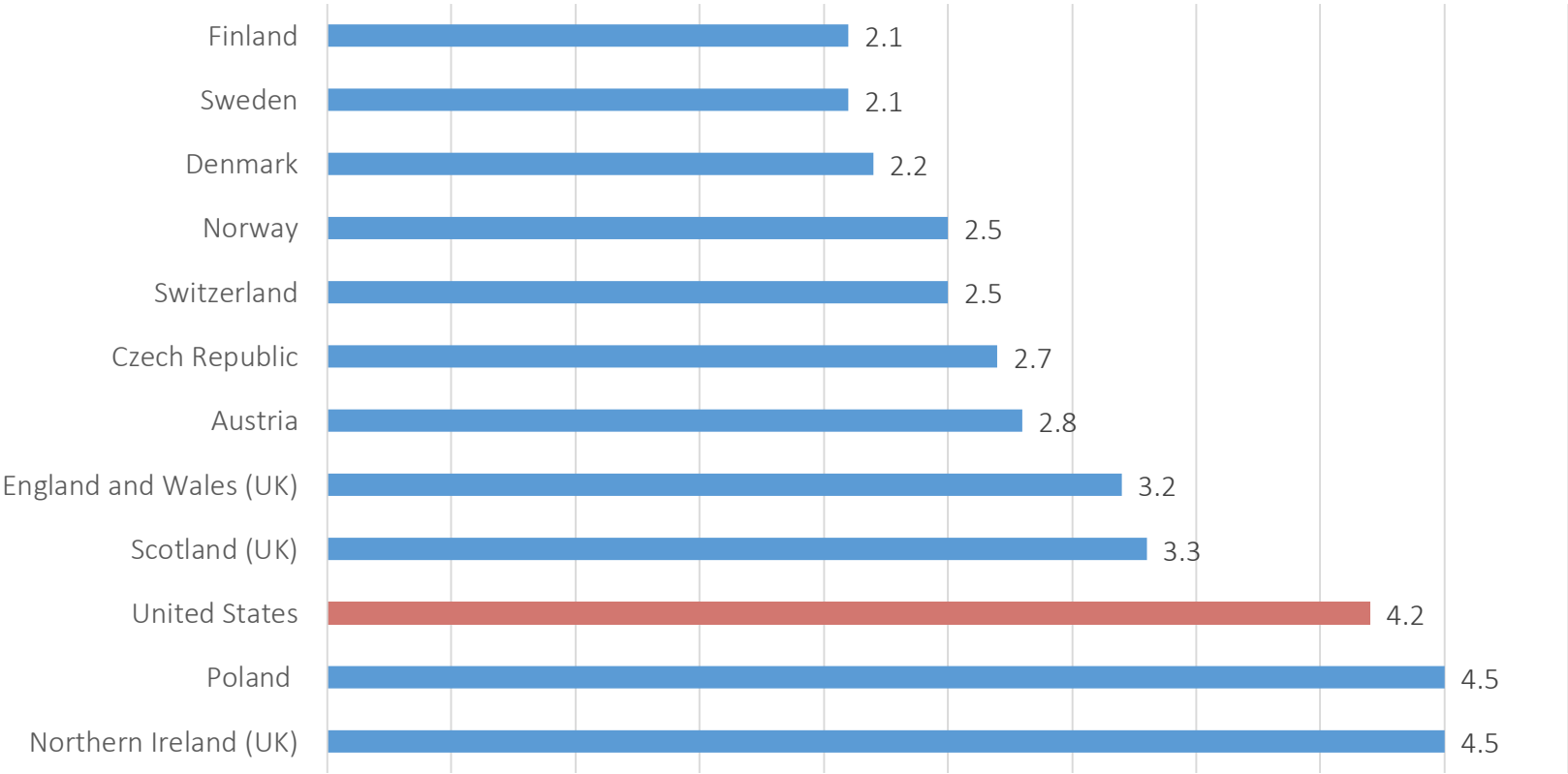
Infant Mortality Rate Country Comparison, Rate per 1,000 Live Births (2010)

Infant Mortality Rate Excluding Births at <24 Weeks of Gestation

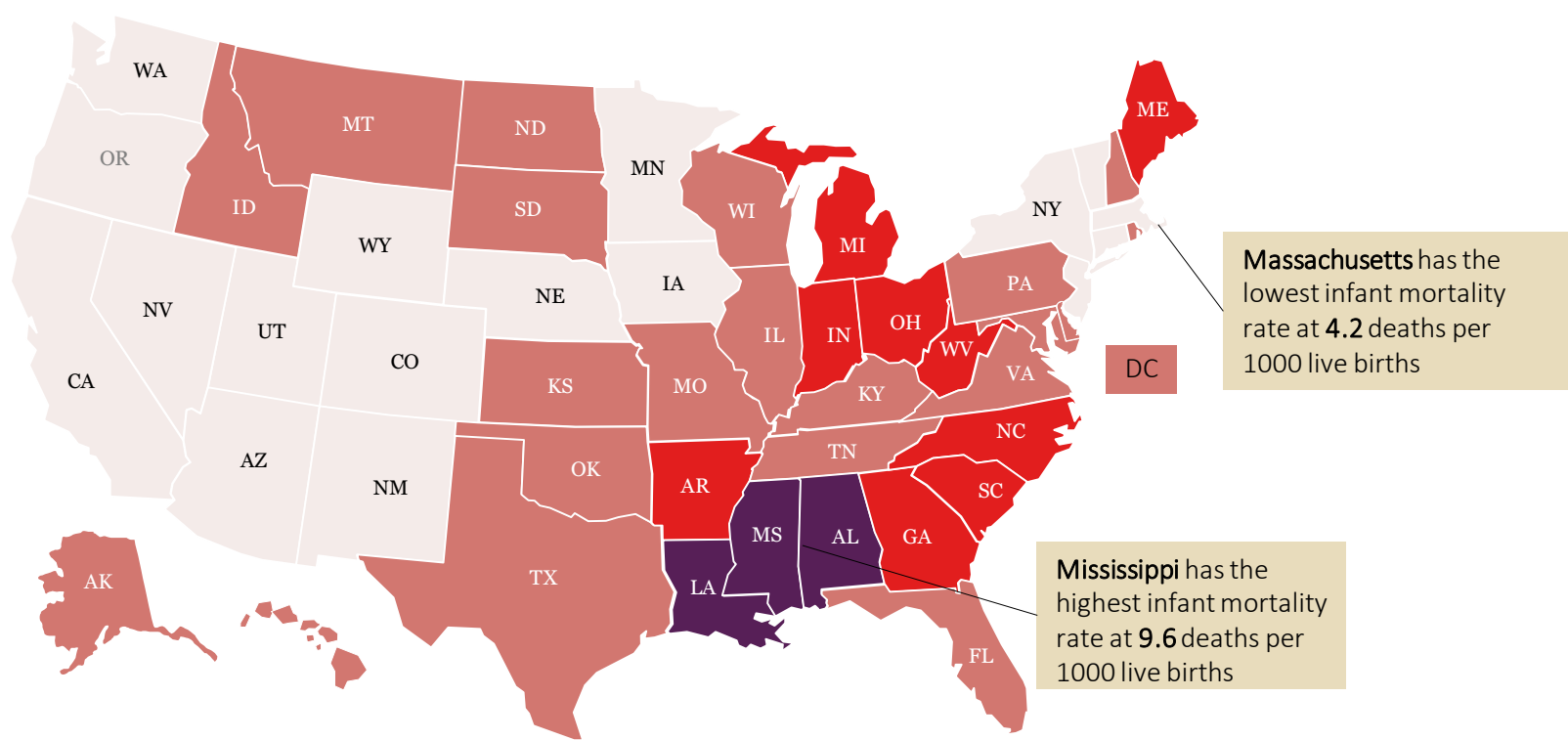

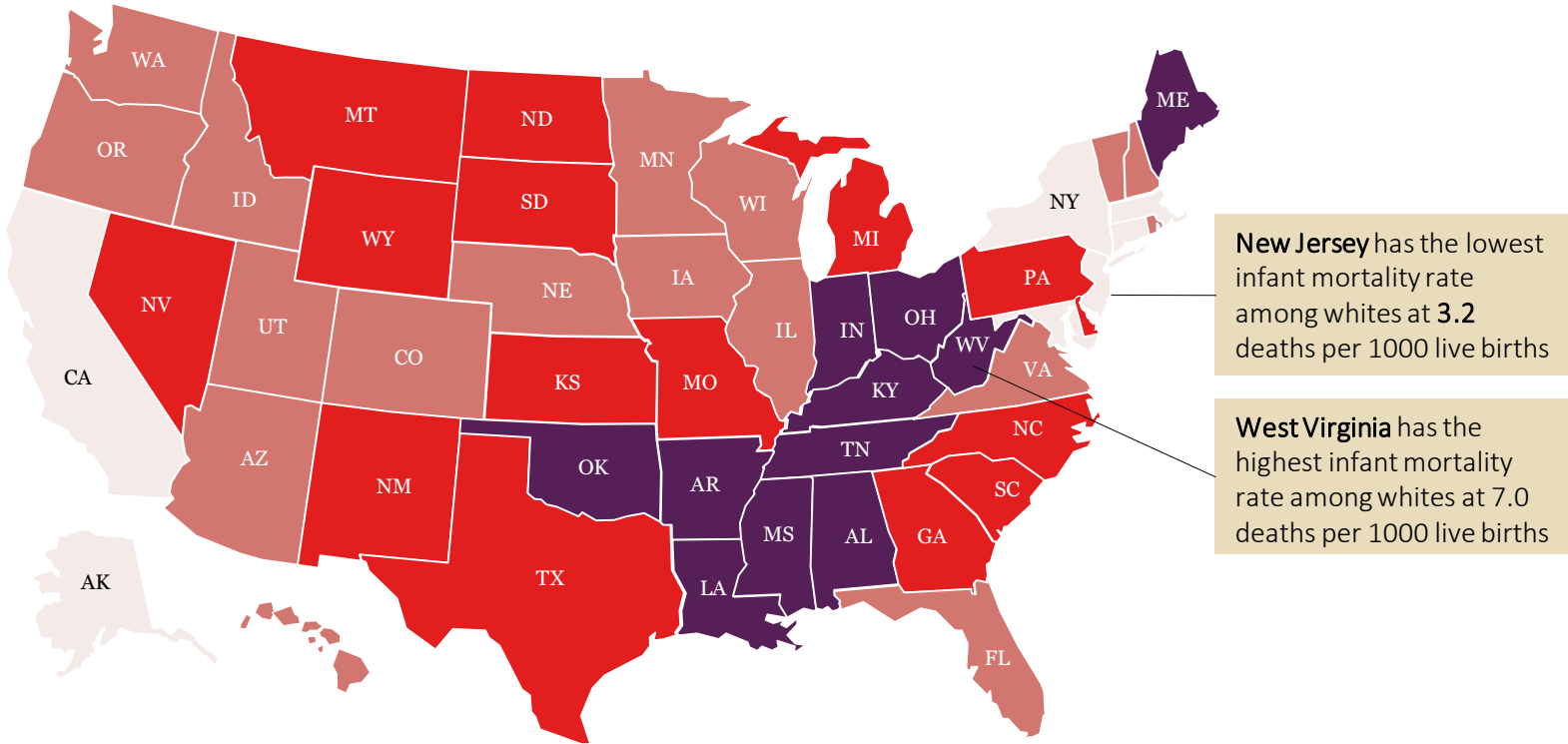

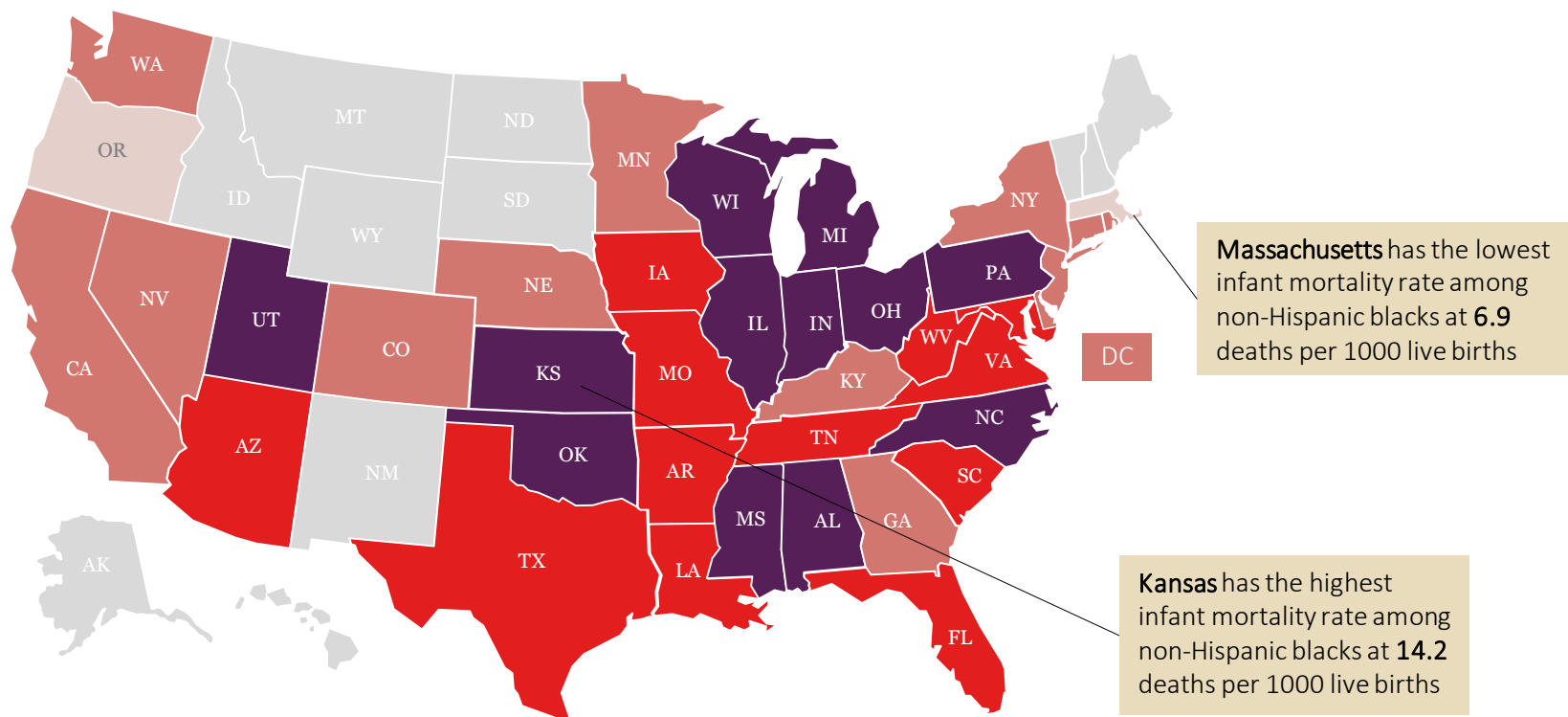

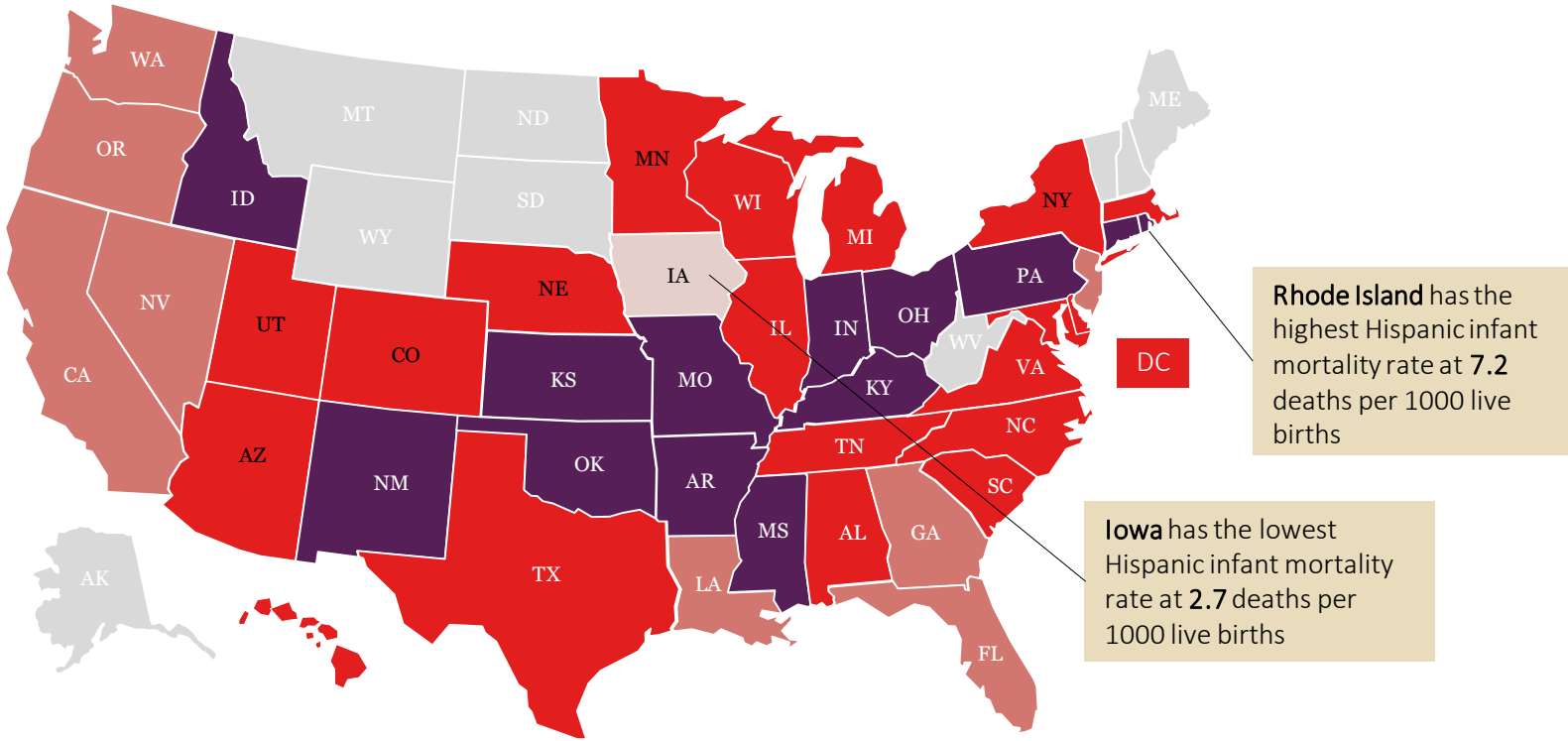
