








Obama Poised to Be an Effective Campaigner for Clinton

Obama's Plans to Campaign

- President Obama, VP Joe Biden, and Senator Elizabeth Warren (D-MA) all endorsed Hillary Clinton in early June
- "Obama and his top aides have been strategizing about how they can reprise his successful 2008 and 2012 approaches to help elect a Democrat to replace him," to make sure real estate mogul Donald Trump (R) or Sen. Ted Cruz (R-TX) can't roll back his legacy
- Obama is poised to be the most active sitting president on the campaign trail in decades; Obama will work to mobilize his coalition of racial minorities, young people and women while Vice President Biden is preparing to campaign heavily in the Rust Belt to appeal to the white, working-class voters who may be drawn to Trump

Obama's Approval Ratings





Quinnipiac University Poll




State	% White
Florida	55%
Nevada	50%
New Hampshire	92%
North Carolina	62%
Ohio	80%
Pennsylvania	77%
Virginia	63%

- Since 2012, Florida's electorate has become 3% less white
- North Carolina and Virginia both have electorates that are 2% less white
- Michigan, Ohio, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin also have electorates that are slightly less white
- Zero states are more white today than they were in 2012
- In 2015, Cook Political Report estimated that demographic shifts from 2012-2016 would have boosted Obama's margin of victory over Romney by 1.5%
