- The American Association for Cancer research hosts congressional briefing on National Cancer Moonshot Initiative

June

29

- On **Wednesday**, Vice President Biden will host a national conference as part of his cancer moonshot project at Howard University
- The Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs holds a roundtable on Zika Preparation

July

1

- On **Friday**, the House Energy and Commerce Health Subcommittee will hold a hearing titled, “Strengthening our National Trauma System”

## Zika Bill to Receive a Vote in the Senate; Opioid Conference Likely Stalled

- The House passed a Zika measure that includes \$1.1 billion in funding, however it is unlikely to get necessary support in the Senate because Democrats object to provisions that limit funding for Planned Parenthood and offset money from Obamacare and Ebola
- With the House on recess until July 5, the opioid conference committee will likely be stalled until next month
