What to expect from Bernie Sanders's campaign appearances

Where Sanders can make a difference for Democrats

- 1. Voter turnout: Sanders could drive low-propensity, progressive voters to the polls, especially college-age voters in areas like Madison, Wisconsin and the Research Triangle in North Carolina. He could also help Clinton to improve her down-ballot effect among white, middle-aged voters in the Rust Belt who are frustrated with trade policies and skeptical of Clinton. Sanders will also likely target voters leaning toward Jill Stein or Gary Johnson.
- 2. Fundraising: As Democrats aim to regain a majority in the Senate, Sanders has been helping to fundraise for Democrat Senate campaigns. Sanders sent emails to his massive list of supporters soliciting donations for Democratic Senate Candidates in Ohio, Nevada, New Hampshire and Pennsylvania.

Date	Scheduled appearances
Sept. 3-4, 2016	Sanders campaigned over Labor Day weekend in New Hampshire on behalf of Hillary Clinton and Senate candidate Maggie Hassan .
Sept. 16, 2016	Sanders will campaign in Pennsylvania with Senate candidate Katie McGinty , who is in a tight race against incumbent Pat Toomey .

Analysis

- Sanders received praise from Democrats and the DNC for his gracious concession to Clinton for the presidential nomination
- According to a DNC insider, Sanders has a "really good" relationship with the committee since the resignation of Debbie Wasserman Schultz
- Sanders appears to be working more closely with the Democratic establishment, which in turn will help him gain more leverage to pursue his liberal policy plans
