## David Wasserman's 6 Risk Factors For House Republicans

### House Republicans in Districts With Well-Educated, Minority Populations Could Be Vulnerable

#### Wasserman's 6 Risk Factors For House GOP Incumbents

- **1. Cook PVI Score:** The Cook Political Report's Partisan Voting Index measures how each state and district performs at the presidential level relative to the nation as a whole. States with a PVI from D+5 R+5 are considered swing states. Wasserman rates any rating of R+5 or worse for Republicans as a risk factor.
- **4. Latino or Asian Population:** Trump is especially unpopular among these racial minorities. Wasserman considers a combined Latino and Asian population of 20% or more in a House Republican's district to be a risk.

- **2. Obama Won District in 2012:** If Obama won the district in 2012, that could be a problem for GOP incumbents. Democrats tend to turn out more in presidential election cycles than non-presidential ones.
- **5. Well Educated Population:** Trump also polls poorly among highly educated people. If over 25% of adults in a district have a bachelor's degree, Wasserman assigns a GOP congressman a risk factor point.

**3. Incumbent Won <55% of Vote in 2012/2014:** Incumbents that were elected into office by a narrow margin are more likely to face a competitive election in 2016.

**6. Well-Funded Democratic Opponent:** Democrat opponents will need funding to be viable opponents. Opponents with more than \$100,000 after Q1 in the bank add another risk factor point.

Donald Trump's historic unpopularity could hurt GOP congressman that have to share a ballot with him this fall. The Cook Political Report's David Wasserman outlined 6 factors that could make congressman especially vulnerable.
