# TPP member countries are already important markets for Florida exports

Connections between Florida and TPP member countries



In 2014, Florida's exports to TPP member countries were worth \$12.5 billion. In total, 21% of Florida's goods exports went to TPP countries in 2014



In 2013, 14,190 Florida-based companies exported goods to TPP countries. 93% of them were small and medium sized companies



In 2011, trade with TPP member countries supported an estimated 873,500 jobs in the state

# TPP tariff elimination for industrial and consumer goods would boost Florida's top export sectors

# TPP impact on Florida's main export industries



#### Chemicals

- \$314 million in exports to TPP new partner countries\* in 2014
- 35% current maximum tariff
- 97.2% of U.S. chemical exports duty-free immediately in TPP new partner countries



# Information and communications technology

- \$161 million in exports to TPP new partner countries\* in 2014
- 35% current maximum tariff
- 99.6% of U.S. information and communications technology exports will be duty-Free immediately in TPP new partner countries\*



## Transportation equipment

- \$251 million in exports to TPP new partner countries\* in 2014
- 25% current maximum tariff
- 99.9% of U.S. transportation equipment exports will be duty-free immediately in TPP new partner countries\*



### **Consumer goods**

- \$120 million in exports to TPP new partner countries\* in 2014
- 189% current maximum tariff
- 90.9% of U.S. consumer goods exports will be duty-free immediately in TPP new partner countries



## **Health products**

- \$231 million in exports to TPP new partner countries\* in 2014
- 30% current maximum tariff
- 99.9% of U.S. health product exports will be dutyfree immediately in the TPP new partner countries\*

# TPP impact on Florida's agriculture



### Boost an export-oriented sector

Export sales are already a vital part of Florida's agriculture sector, which had total cash receipts of \$8.5 billion in 2014



### Create jobs

 The agricultural impact of TPP is expected to create more than 1,520 jobs in Florida

## **Background**

 The TPP's provisions seek to eliminate agricultural export subsidies, discourage export restrictions, ensure food safety, and standardize health and safety measures for agricultural sectors in member countries



### **Increase net exports**

 TPP implementation is expected to increase Florida's net agricultural exports by \$202.1 million a year, and cash receipts by \$296.7 million a year



#### Reduce trade costs

Eliminating tariffs and other trade barriers on Florida's agricultural exports to TPP member countries will increase trade for most of Florida's main agricultural products, particularly fruits and nuts, vegetables, beef and processed food products
