




## Clinton has more money left to spend than Trump

- Outside groups' cash on hand (Republicans)




## **Clinton has spent more money Trump**

- Money spent by outside groups (Republicans)





Millions of dollars; as of September 21





Money in the bank of GOP candidate(s) Money in the bank of Democratic candidate(s)







#### Campaign fundraising by Senate race











Outside spending (independent expenditures) by September 21








## Highest spending sectors donate more to Republicans


## Different types of advocacy groups have distinct benefits and limits

Advocacy groups and their regulations












