

# The climate change memorandum provides guidance for agencies through the rest of Obama's presidency

### Timeline of climate change/national security memorandum

Sept. O 2016

#### White House released climate change and national security memorandum

President Obama released a memorandum calling for climate change to be considered when formulating national security strategy. His memorandum called for a Climate Change and National Security Working Group tasked with analyzing and then crafting an action plan for federal agencies.

Dec. C 2016

#### Working group releases action plan

The working group releases its action plan outlining how to incorporate climate change into national security. This provides a broad outline for federal agencies working on national security to begin implementing rules.

Jan. 2017

#### Federal agencies finish their agency-specific action plans

All the federal agencies involved in the working group must complete agency-specific plans on how they will incorporate climate change into their national security goals.
