Professional highlights and diplomatic agenda

- Ambassador Aung Lynn began his career in government in 1982, joining Myanmar's Ministry of Irrigation as an assistant engineering geologist
- He was appointed third secretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Yangon in 1983, and later served as consul at the Myanmar Consulate in Hong Kong
- Aung has also held postings at the Embassy of Myanmar in Pretoria, South Africa, and at Myanmar's Permanent Mission to the United Nations
- As director-general of the ASEAN Affairs Department in Myanmar's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Aung Lynn focused his efforts in recent years on promoting US-ASEAN cooperation
- He is expected to continue to voice support for strengthened US-ASEAN ties and the United States' overall engagement in Southeast Asia
- Aung Lynn will look to leverage the United States' support for Myanmar's new democracy and build momentum to strengthen US-Myanmar relations, especially as the US prepares for a new administration next January
- He will likely encourage increased American investment in Myanmar, the further lifting of sanctions, and the development of bilateral strategic initiatives to support Myanmar's economic growth
