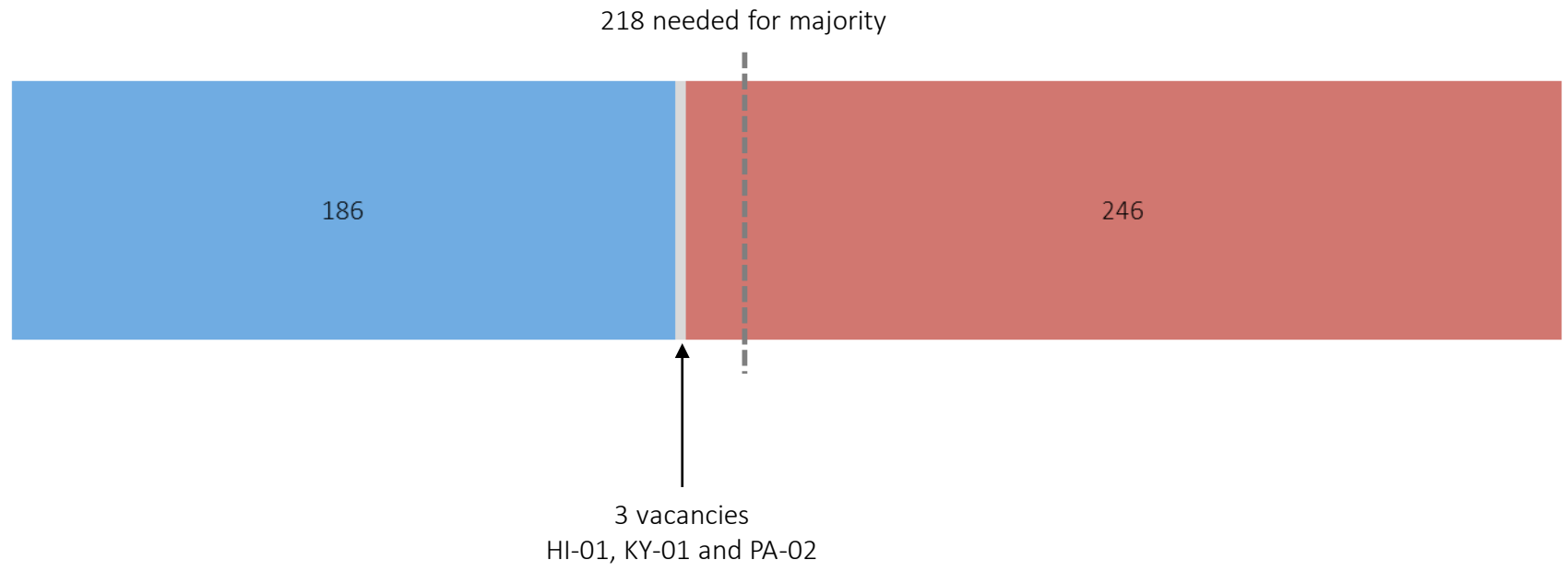

■ Democrat ■ Republican

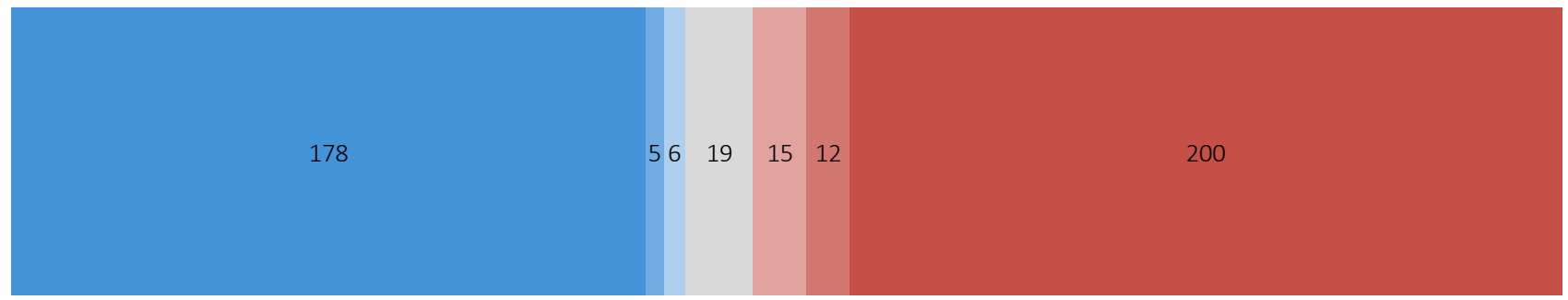

2016 House race ratings, by party

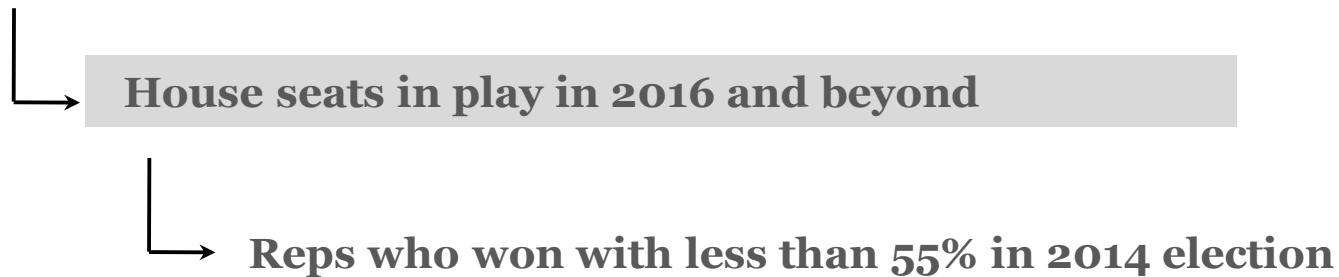

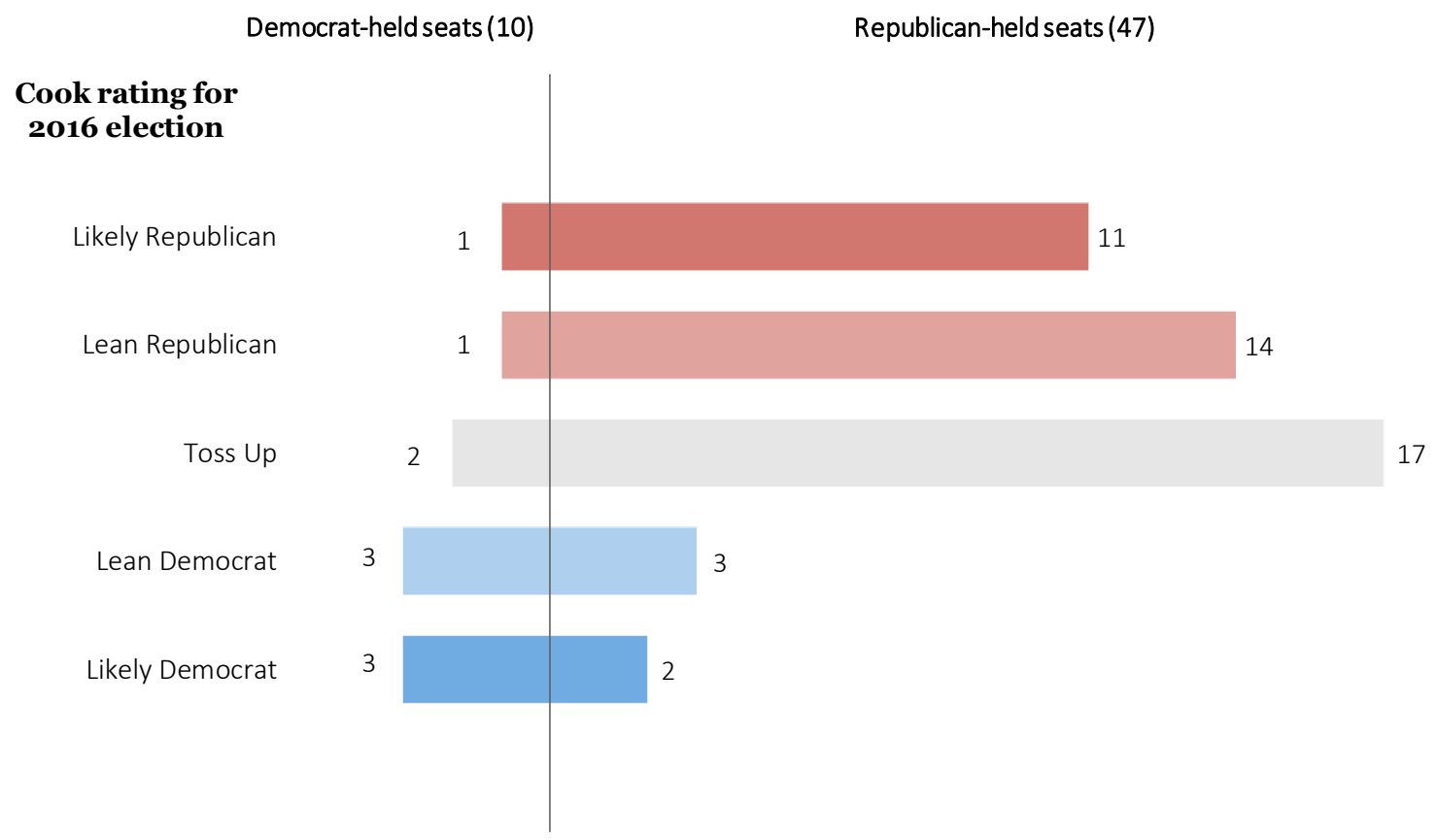

19 seats rated as toss up races, only two are currently held by a Democrat

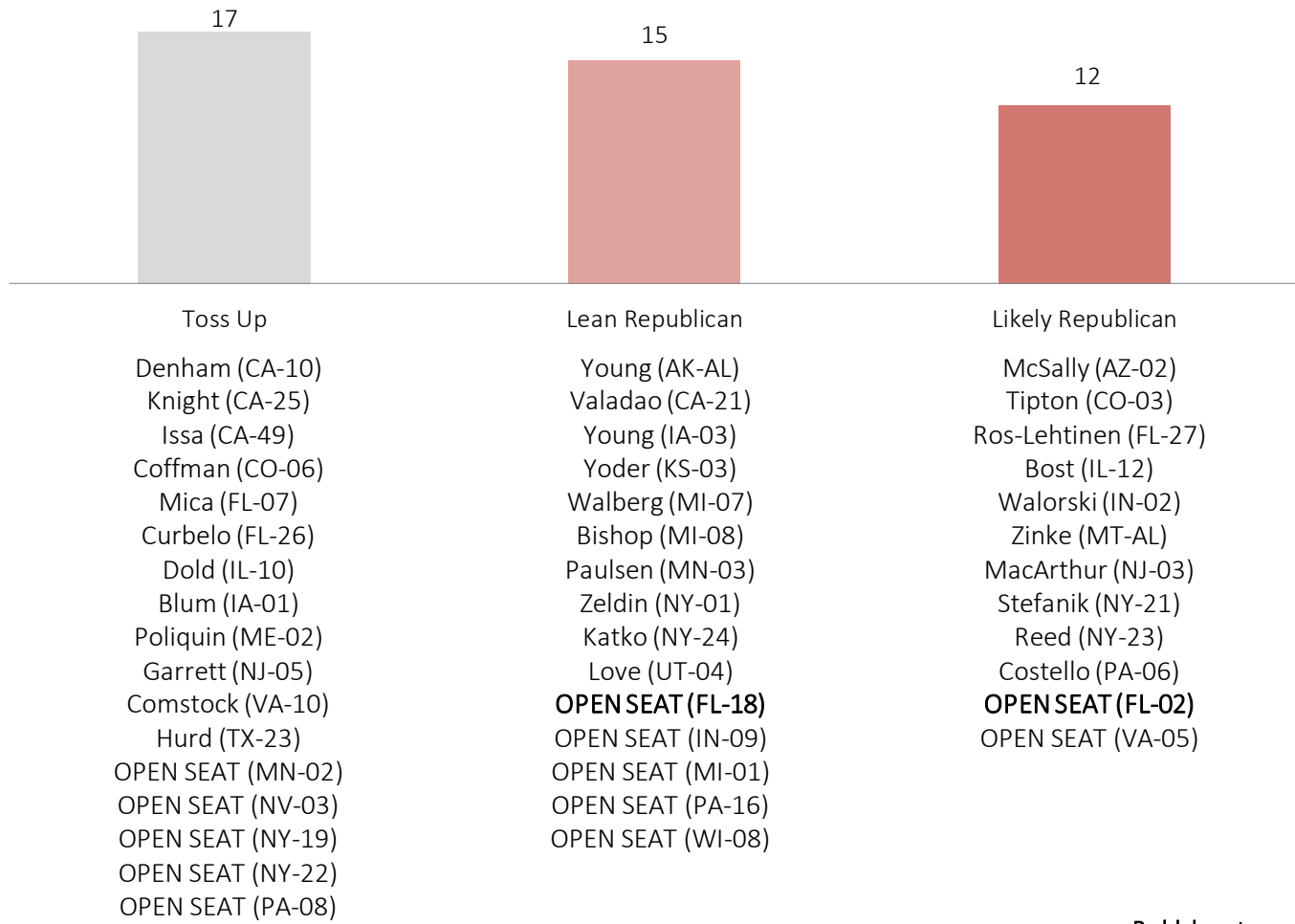
House seats in play in 2016, by Cook Political Report rating

Breakdown of 2016 House Races, by Cook Political Report Rating

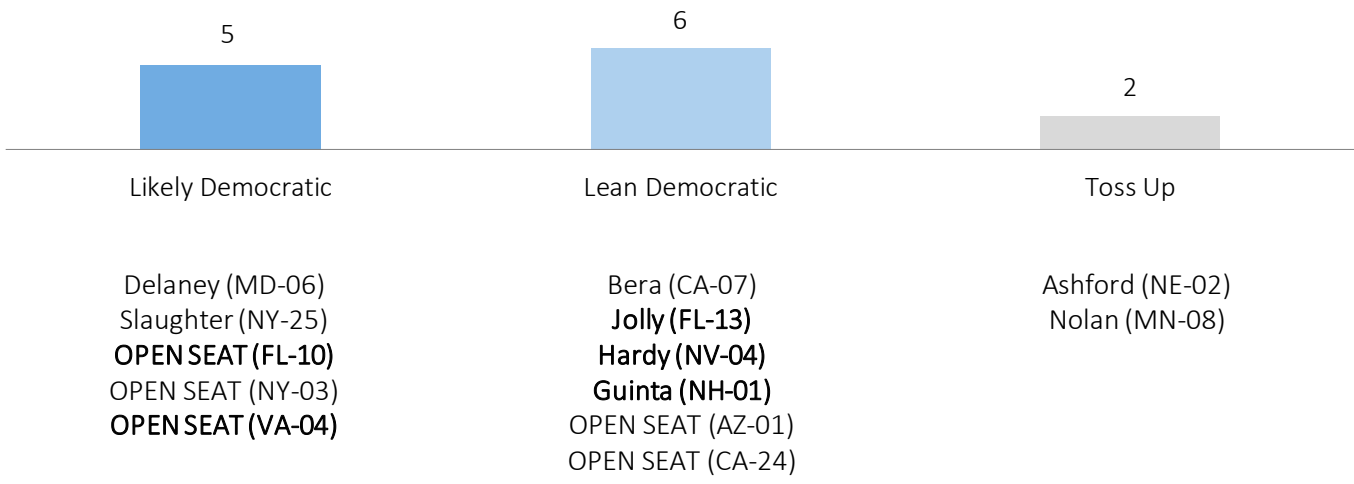

Breakdown of 2016 House races, by Cook Political Report rating

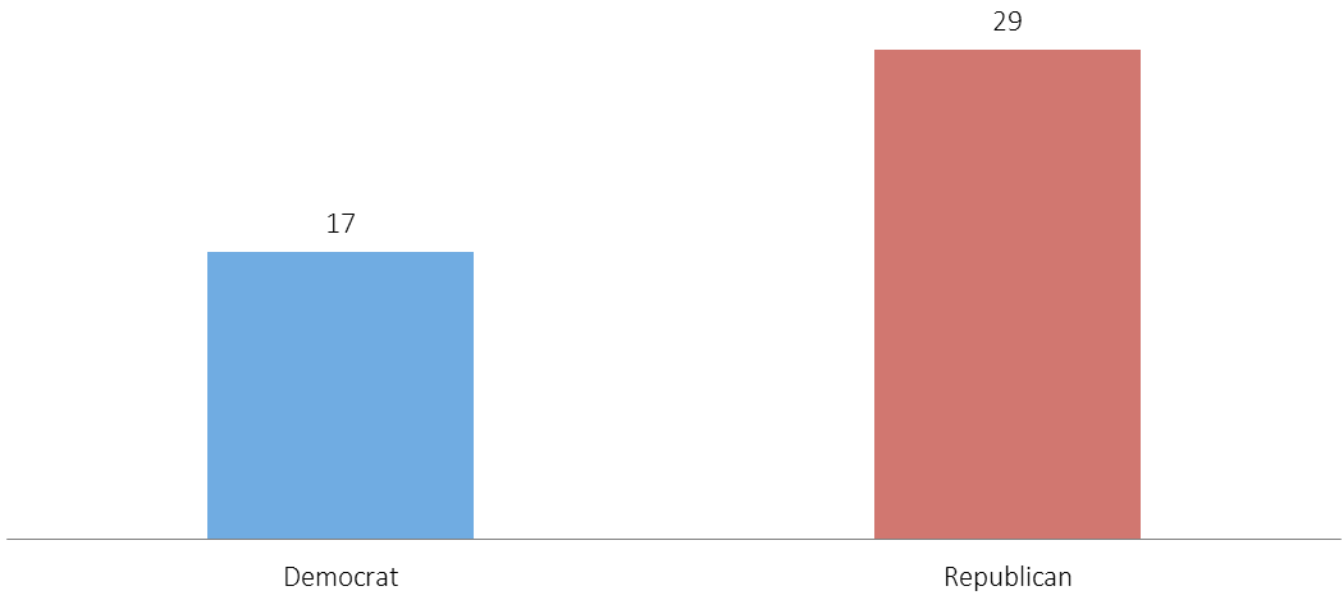

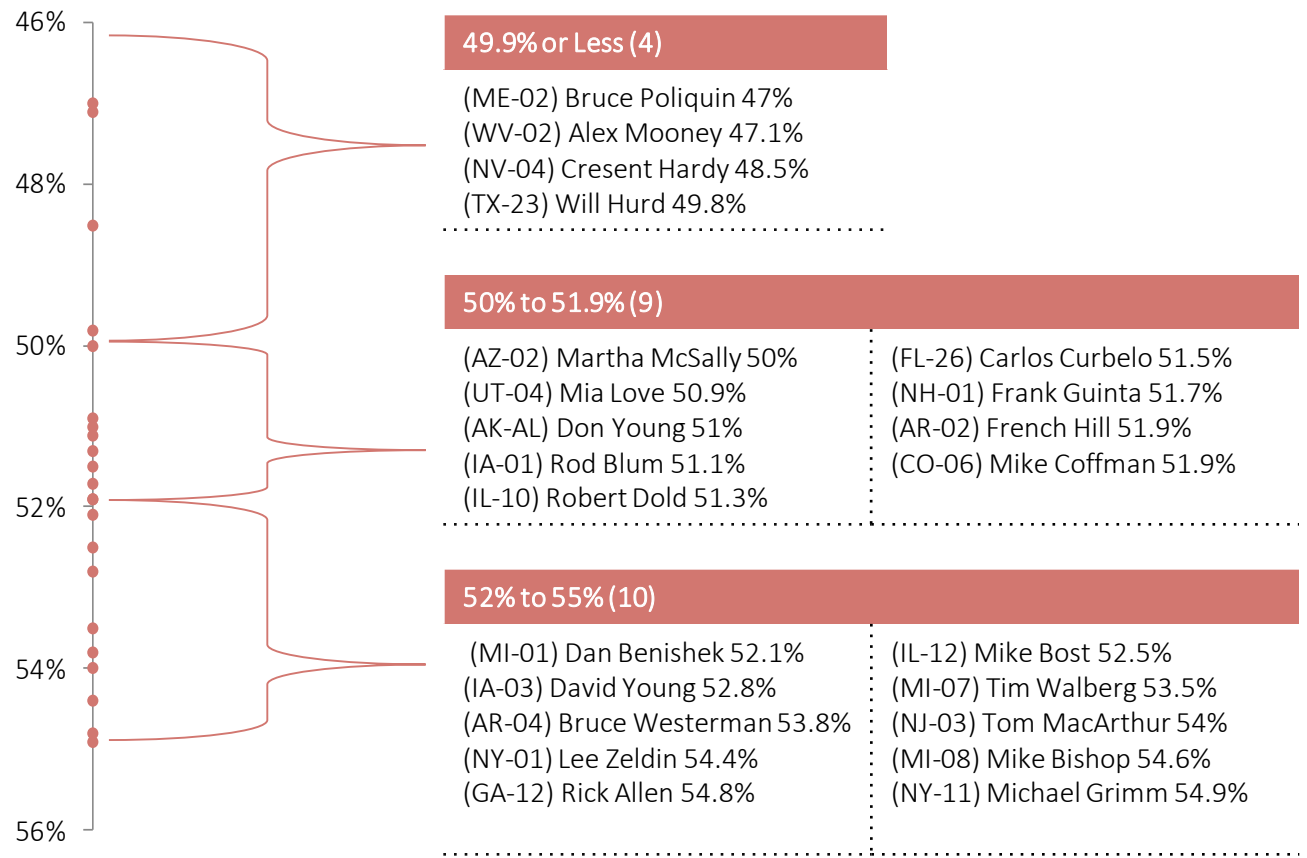

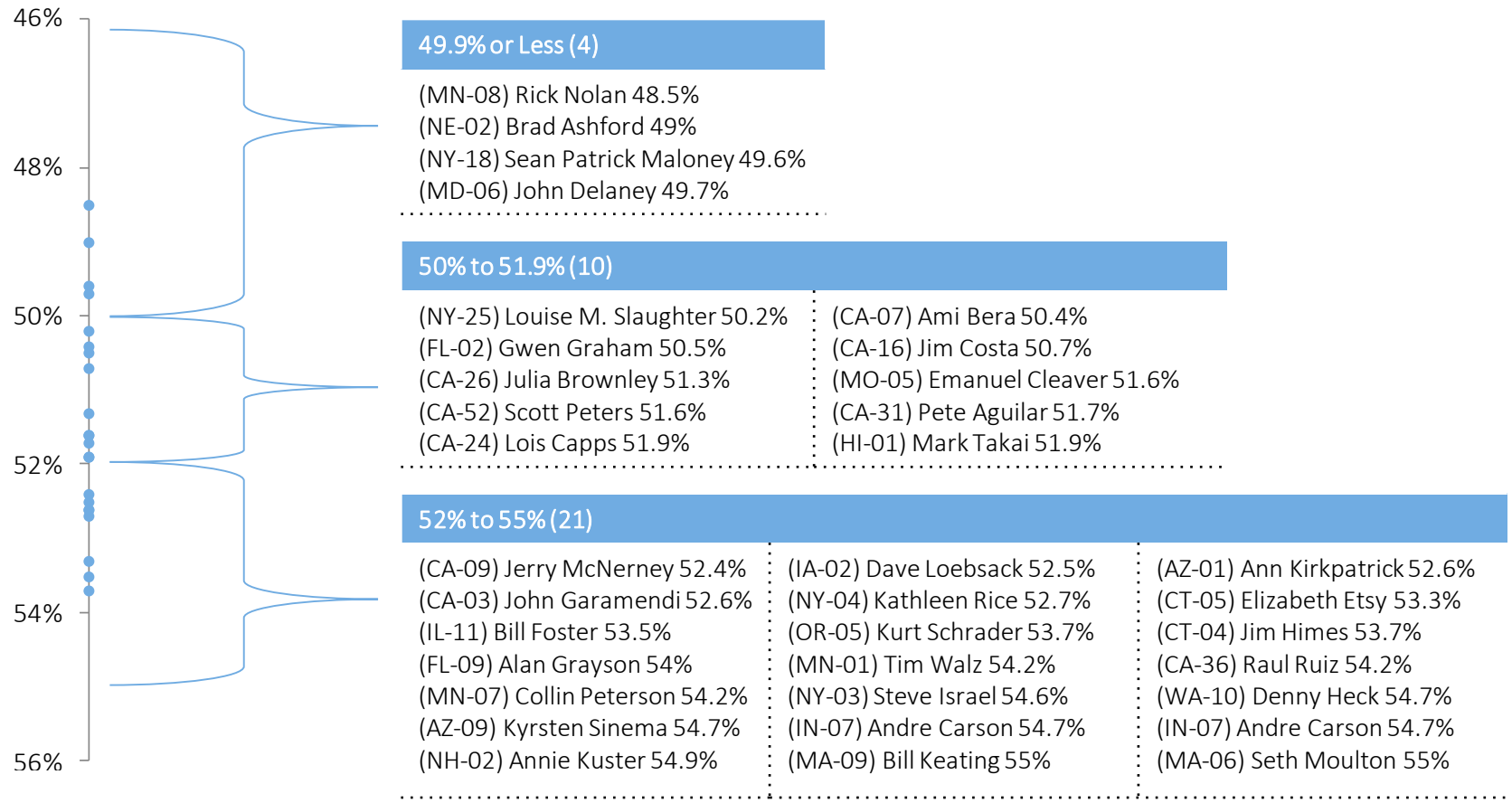
