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




Analysis


- Wayne county (home of Detroit) failed Hillary Clinton in two ways: she ran about 7
 points behind Obama's vote share in 2012 and turnout in the county was down by over
 50,000 votes.
- Trump ran up the score in the Upper Peninsula and the northern counties of Michigan's "mitten," running 10 points or more ahead of Romney's vote share in 2012.

Comparing 2012 and 2016 presidential election results




Hillary Clinton only wins one rural county but manages to best Trump in urban areas by 5 points


