
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#### Donald Trump wins every county in West Virginia

#### **Analysis**

- Trump's worst county-level performance in the state was in Monongalia county, home to Morgantown and West Virginia University.
- Despite her 2008 primary win in the state and Bill Clinton's general election wins in both 1992 and 1996, many voters held extremely negative views of Hillary after statement indicating that she would put a lot of coal miners and companies out of business.




## All counties voted Republican in 2012 and 2016 but Trump produced even higher margins than Romney
