Friday,
January 27

- **Federal Communications Commission** holds a meeting of the Consumer Advisory Committee (9:00 AM)
- **New America** holds a discussion of "Security in the Horn of Africa" (3:00 PM)
- **UK Prime Minister Theresa May** will meet with President Trump at the White House

The White House:

- On Monday, President Trump will hold a roundtable discussion in the morning with business leaders and another roundtable in the afternoon with union leaders, in addition to signing executive actions against the TPP
- In the afternoon and evening, President Trump will meet with congressional leaders of both parties before a one-on-one meeting with Speaker of the House Paul Ryan
- Press Secretary Sean Spicer will hold his first "official" press briefing from the White House Press Briefing Room at 1:30 P.M.
- No official schedule has been posted, but Pres. Trump is expected to hold more roundtable discussions on the economy and national security
- Friday, UK Prime Minister Theresa May is scheduled to meet with President Trump at the White House
