Bash most recently served as the executive VP of operations and business development at the Doctors' Hospital at Renaissance. A graduate of Harvard Law School, Bash clerked for Justice Alito and served as deputy director of policy and communications for Ted Cruz's presidential campaign.

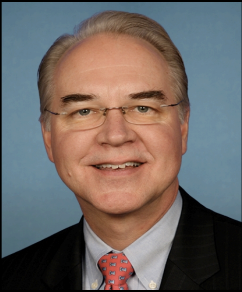


**Katy Talento**

## Overview of key healthcare players in President Trump’s HHS



**Rep. Tom Price**  
*HHS Secretary-nominee*  
Price is an orthopedic surgeon who has represented Georgia’s 6<sup>th</sup> district since 2004. He has experience as head of the House Budget Committee and is poised to dismantle the ACA and advocate for more state control over health spending. Democrats have tried to seize on reports regarding some questionable stock trades to derail his nomination.



**Seema Verma**  
*CMS Administrator nominee*  
Verma is the owner and CEO of SVC Inc., a strategic health policy consulting firm. In her capacity as a health policy consultant, she helped design conservative Medicaid expansion waivers for GOP governors in a number of states.



**Dr. Anne Schuchat**  
*Interim CDC director*  
Schuchat is an epidemiologist who joined the CDC in 1988. She served as principal deputy director and has assumed interim leadership until Trump makes his pick.



**Vacant**  
*FDA Commissioner*  
Names suggested for this key position include Balaji Srinivasin and Jim O’Neil, both of whom have garnered reputations in Silicon Valley as libertarians. Dr. Scott Gottlieb, a fellow at AEI, is another possible nominee.



**Dr. Francis Collins**  
*NIH Director*  
President Trump asked Dr. Collins to stay on as NIH director, at least for now.




