# Clinton beats Trump in Hawaii by wide 30-point margin

#### **Analysis**

- Clinton ran behind Obama's 2012 performance by about 8 points.
- Despite not reaching Obama's level of support, Clinton joins Obama as one of the only two Democratic presidential candidates to capture more than 60% of the vote in Hawaii.





Amendment 2: Appropriations	"Shall the legislature be provided, when the state general fund balance at the close of each of two successive fiscal years exceeds five per cent of the general fund revenues for each of the two fiscal years, the additional alternatives of appropriating general funds for the pre-payment of either or both of the following:  (1) Debt service for general obligation bonds issued by the State; or  (2) Pension or other post-employment benefit liabilities accrued for state employees?"	50.1%	35.9%

The percentages displayed are the percentages of all ballots cast in the election because the "yes" votes must equal a majority of all votes cast in order for the measure to be enacted.
