## Main takeaways from the nomination hearing for deputy and associate attorney general

Deputy Attorney General nominee Rod Rosenstein declined to commit to appointing a special prosecutor for Russia investigations



## Rod Rosenstein (deputy attorney general nominee)

- Would be acting attorney general in cases where AG Jeff Sessions has recused himself
- Deputy AG is the **point of contact for the White House** and **oversees the day-to-day operations** of the Department of Justice
- Testified that he **would wait to see** what investigations are in place and content of investigations **before he would decide whether to appoint a special prosecutor**
- Could not commit to Sen. Durbin that he would release to American public if a Russia investigation exists
- He could not comment on tobacco industry lawsuit from the 1990s, but that he believed the ruling, that companies do not have a 1<sup>st</sup> amendment right to fraudulent speech, was correct



## Rachel Brand (associate attorney general nominee)

- Has worked as a public servant but also as a litigator for the Chamber of Commerce
- Associate AG oversees the antitrust and civil divisions, among others including the office of violence against women
- Testified that her previous work would not reflect her commitment to **represent the American public as a public servant**
- Declined to respond to Sen. Whitehouse's question of whether there is a public interest in addressing climate change

Many Democratic Senators also demanded that AG Sessions return to the committee to testify about his response on meeting with Russians
