
Trump proposes terminating the Essential Air Service program in his FY18 budget request

Analysis

- The Essential Air Service program (EAS) subsidizes commercial flights for rural airports to guarantee small communities access to commercial air service
- EAS started as a temporary program in 1978 and was passed alongside the Airline Deregulation Act
- Over 40 airports in Alaska receive service as a result of EAS subsidies
- According to the White House budget proposal, eliminating the program would save \$175 million per year
