President Trump softened his rhetoric on Islam in his speech at the Arab Islamic American Summit

He notably avoided using the term "radical Islamic terrorism"

- President Trump spoke before a gathering of 55 leaders and representatives from Arab and majority-Muslim countries
- The summit's slogan was "Together we Prevail"
- He did not focus on human rights, but rather said he was **not** there to "lecture"
