### Russia's military is far larger than those of the Baltic states



## Timeline of key recent Russian intrusions in the Baltic states

#### Overview of incidents from 2014 on

September 5, 2014 **Abduction of Estonian security service operative:** Russian agents enter Estonian territory and abduct a security operative in a raid that jammed communications and used smoke grenades

September 19, C 2014 **Lithuanian vessel detained:** Russian officers detain a Lithuanian shipping vessel in international waters

**Military exercise on the border:** 2,000 Russian paratroopers conduct military drills on the border of Estonia and Latvia

**Buildup of weapons:** Throughout 2015, Russia began concentrating weapons in Kaliningrad, a Russian exclave between Poland and Lithuania, concerning the Baltic states

**Airspace violations:** Estonia reported six airspace violations by Russian jets, a common occurrence over many Baltic states

**Cyber attacks:** Lithuania reported finding Russian spyware on its government computers over the last two years, and the spyware attempted to infect computers 20 times in 2016

## Military exercise will put 100,000 Russian troops on NATO's eastern border

Baltic countries are preparing for the large buildup of troops



#### The exercise:

- The upcoming Russian military exercise, Zapad 2017, will put 100,000 troops on NATO's border
- The exercise generally takes place every year with Belarus and simulates a full-scale conflict with the West
- This will be the first such military exercise since Russia annexed Crimea in 2014





- Baltic officials have expressed concern that Russia could leave troops in Belarus after the exercise ends
- Increasing anxiety further over the exercise, Russian politicians have begun suggesting that
  certain Lithuanian provinces were given to the country by Joseph Stalin- rhetoric
  reminiscent of the Russian government's claims of historical ownership of Crimea and
  eastern Ukraine
- US Defense Secretary Jim Mattis called the military exercise "simply destabilizing," even if it goes to plan



#### **Steps to prepare:**

- Lithuanian Minister of Defense Raimundas Karoblis plans to treat it as just an exercise, but remains prepared in case of border protection checks or if the troops move a different direction than planned
- The Baltic states have increased their military budgets, but largely rely on their allies in NATO and the EU for assistance and protection


- NATO members pledged to contribute troops to the eastern flank at the 2016 Warsaw Summit
- Battlegroups are led by one framework nation and helped by contributing nations
- The battlegroups are intended to show NATO's "strengthened deterrence and defense posture" and is a reminder of the alliance's commitment to Article 5
