Takeaways from the Texas primary election: the beginning of the 2018 midterm season

Turnout

- A Dome
 - Democrat turnout was 84% higher than in 2014; Republican turnout increased 14%
 - Republicans still cast more primary ballots than Democrats: 1.54 million to 1.04 million
 - Democratic turnout was highest in metropolitan areas and suburbs

Runoffs

- More than 30 elections are headed to a runoff in Texas
- · Races headed to a runoff:
 - Governor (Ds)
 - 2nd district (Rs)
 - 5th district (Rs)
 - 6th district (Rs & Ds)
 - 21st district (Rs & Ds)
 - 27th district (Rs & Ds)

Women

- Over 25 women advanced to the runoffs or won outright
- Texas is on track to elect its first two Latina members of Congress
- All of the EMILY's List-endorsed candidates won outright or advanced to a runoff



 Beto O'Rourke currently represents El Paso in the US House.





