NJ Hotline ranks potential 2020 Democratic presidential contenders

Updated July 19, 2018

Sen. Kamala Harris (D-CA)

- Already a coveted surrogate on the campaign trail
- Leading voice of the Left on immigration
- Has boosted candidates in California elections



Sen. Bernie Sanders (I-VT)

- Has strong name recognition from his 2016 presidential campaign
- Recently traveled through three battleground states in one weekend



Sen. Elizabeth Warren (D-MA)

- Visited troops in Iraq on a bipartisan trip for Independence Day 2018
- Raised \$15+ million for a noncompetitive election cycle
- Has traveled around the country campaigning in Democratic primaries



Former New Orleans Mayor Mitch Landrieu

- Appeals to both moderates and progressives with his mayoral record
- Presided over an education miracle in New Orleans, boosting results for lower-income students in an all-charter system



Sen. Cory Booker (D-NJ)

- · High-energy candidate
- Has visited state party fundraisers throughout the country
- Consistently tackles issues of racial injustice

Updated July 19, 2018

Sen. Kirsten Gillibrand (D-NY)

- Has moved to boost her national profile
- First in the Senate to call for abolishing Immigration and Customs Enforcement



Sen. Sherrod Brown (D-OH)

- Populist views on trade and reliably liberal on every other issue
- Represents a state won by Trump by 8
 points and could have rare crossover appeal

Former Attorney General Eric Holder

- As Obama's AG, could run with the message to restore Obama's legacy
- Made a stop in New Hampshire early in the summer



New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo

- Already has \$31 million on hand due to competitive New York gubernatorial primary
- Started moving to the left despite more moderate background



Rep. Seth Moulton (D-MA)

- Has clashed with House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi, boosting his national profile
- Already visited Iowa, Ohio, Michigan and New Hampshire this year
- Started Serve America PAC to recruit military candidates to office



- Strong name recognition from a lifetime in politics
- Passed on a run in 2016
