

- A majority (77 percent) of Republicans say that Kavanaugh should be confirmed regardless of the truth of the allegations
- 52 percent of women believe Ford, and 27 percent believe Kavanaugh
- 77 percent of Republican men believe Kavanaugh
- 74 percent of Democratic women believe Ford
- Polling was conducted after the Sept. 27 Senate Judiciary Committee hearing with Kavanaugh and Ford




Views divide by political affiliation and gender


- A majority (54 percent) of Republicans say that Kavanaugh should be confirmed regardless of the truth of the allegations

- 56 percent of Democratic women believe Ford
- Polling was conducted prior to the Sept. 27 Senate Judiciary Committee hearing with Kavanaugh and Ford



Who do you think is telling the truth about what happened at the party in high school?









Who do you think is telling the truth about what happened at the party in high school?
