## Voter turnout in the 2018 midterm elections was the highest it has been in several decades

## Voter turnout in midterm elections, 1982-2018\*



- Minnesota had the highest voter turnout in 2018, at an estimated 64%
- About 46% of Texan voters turned out, 14 points higher than the average Texas turnout from 1982-2014
- Georgia's turnout (about 55%) was 21 points higher than the state's average from 1982-2014
- Hawaii had the lowest turnout, at 39.3%
